The Practical Issues

- If your child wishes to bring a snack in for morning break they may bring in a piece of fruit only.
- Two pairs of shoes are required for school, one pair for outdoors and another pair for indoors (plimsoles). Trainers need to be worn for outdoor sports/activities.
- Please make sure all water bottles, lunch boxes and clothing is clearly marked with your child's name or initials for easy identification.

- Lockers: Just like in Year 3, each child will have their own locker for which they are responsible. Everything must be kept inside and tidy. Red school bags with straps can be hung on the back of their chair in class.
- Reading Books: Each child will have a reading book and it will need to be in school everyday as they will have daily quiet reading time. This is also a chance for them to change their reading book. Reading Records need to be signed every time you hear your child read and these will be checked and signed by myself or a TA every Friday morning.

Pens/Pencils

- Children are only allowed to use pencil in their books unless they have a pen licence from Year 3.
- Felt tip pens are not acceptable to use in books, classwork and homework. Children may use colouring pencils to colour, decorate or annotate their work in their books.
- They can bring <u>one</u> pencil case to class if they wish which must be able to fit in their drawer.

PE

PE sessions on Tuesday afternoons will be led by Mr. Macey. His lessons will involve:

Sept-Oct (1st half term) – Football skills

Oct-Dec (2nd half term) – Ball handling skills

Jan-Feb (1st half term) – Hockey

Feb-March (2nd half term) – Racket skills

March-July (Summer term) – Cricket/Athletics

PE on Friday afternoons will be led by myself, which will be dance/gymnastics.

Year 4 go swimming in the Spring term (letters will be sent out nearer the time)

Homework

Each child will be issued with:

A homework diary

A Reading record book

A Maths homework book

A English homework book

A Learning Log

A spelling book

A Times Table book

- Presentation is equally as important in these books as it is in their books at school.
- Homework needs to be handed in by the day that is specified. They are responsible for handing their homework in on time, putting it in the correct box and ticking their name off the list.

Homework Timetable

- Monday: Spellings and times tables (For test on Friday)
- Tuesday: Maths (Due on Thursday)
- Wednesday: English (Due on Monday)
- Thursday: Science/RE/Topic (Due Tuesday)
- Friday: Mathletics (Due Monday)
- Reading for 20 minutes everyday.
- All homework tasks will be written in homework diaries.
- · Homework diaries need to be signed at the end of every week.
- Homework diaries will be checked and signed by us every Monday.

Homework

- Homework should take no longer than 20 minutes a night (unless it is part of a topic), plus 20 minutes of reading. Children have a reading record where they can record their progress.
- The homework diary is also a communication link between home and school, however they will not be looked at on a daily basis.
 Therefore, if you have an urgent message for me then please send a note with your child to hand in to me.

Home Time

- Children will leave their class and meet the person responsible for their collection on the junior playground, just as in Year 3.
- The children are aware that if the person who is collecting them is not there then they must return to their classroom where an adult will assist them.
