



Sports Premium Statement

September 2017 – August 2018

Since April 2013, the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport have funded £150 million to support the delivery of PE and school sport. Funding is allocated to all state maintained Secondary, Primary, Middle and Special Schools (including Non Maintained Special Schools), Academies and Pupil Referral Units with Primary aged pupils. Our school has received £8,880 for the academic year 2017-2018.

During the year 2016-17, we have continued to use our Sports Premium Grant to improve the quality of PE and Sports Provision and encourage a healthy lifestyle for all at St Thomas More. This has been used in the following ways:
