Let's Learn

This Sunday is the second Sunday of Advent. In Church, the second candle on the Advent wreath will be lit. Do you know what colour the candle is?



This candle is the symbol of faith and is often referred to as the Bethlehem Candle. The candle's name has its origins in the prophet Micah, who prophesied Jesus would be born in Bethlehem. We are reminded of the faith

the prophets had in God as they delivered His message, and the faith of the early Christians in Jesus as the promised Messiah.

Let's Read

Philippians 1: 9-11

This is my prayer for you: that your love will grow more and more; that you will have knowledge and understanding with your love; that you will see the difference between good and bad and choose the good; that you will be pure and without wrong for the coming of Christ; that you will be filled with the good things produced in your life by Christ to bring glory and praise to God.

Let's Reflect

In his letter, Paul prays that his readers will come to know and understand more about the love God has for them, in order to deepen their faith. The love described by Paul is an active, lived-out love.

How will you live-out your love for God this Advent? How will you grow in faith?
