Scripture

Isaiah 9: 2-6

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness— on them light has shined.

For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders: and he is named Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Reflect and Pray

Isaiah was writing during a long period of time when people felt really lost and sad, like they were in a really dark place. They had forgotten about God and had turned their



backs on His love, making choices that made God

sad

Isaiah knew that God wanted to save his people. Isaiah told people about a Saviour who was going to save humanity and guide them back into the light of God's love.

Look back at how Jesus was described: Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace



Isaiah was informing us of what Jesus was going to be like, long before he was sent to this earth. He was to be a listener and guide to the right direction; a powerful hero; a compassionate protector; the establisher of peace across the land.

In letting the people know what the Messiah was going to be like, Isaiah was helping them to prepare for His arrival. It brought hope to the people on Earth. It was a promise from God that He would save them, showing his unconditional love, even when they had rejected Him.
