Dear Families,

A message from Mrs Little:

As we prepare for Christmas, I can see how blessed I am to be the Executive Headteacher of two Catholic Primary Schools. To hear the children singing is a delight, and the awe and wonder of the Christmas Story has been so beautifully told by our youngest children.

I am also writing to share a personal message. Some of you may know that I reached a 'significant' birthday last summer, and with that, the reality of my parents being elderly and very far away (they live in Canada) was something we discussed as a family. My lovely Dad was

diagnosed with Alzheimer's dementia a few years ago and my Mum needs ever increasing support to be able to care for him. I don't know how much precious time I will be able to have with them both and being a Headteacher means I have little flexibility in when I am able to go and visit and help care for them both. I have therefore taken the very difficult decision that this is the right time for me to retire from this role so that I am able to spend as much time as possible and treasure the moments and memories I have with them both.

I will therefore be officially retiring from my Executive Headteacher role at the end of this academic year, in the summer of 2024.

The Governing Boards of both schools will work closely with the ASCAT CEO to recruit a new Executive Headteacher and I am sure you will hear more about this in due course.

This Christmas, I hope we will all be able to reflect on the importance of family, to celebrate the love we have and where there are challenges faced, that we can draw on the strength of Our Saviour, Jesus Christ who became known to us on Christmas Day, to be with us and comfort us, and know we are all loved.
